1. Think from the point of view of the reader. What keywords would the reader search for that would help retrieve your article? 2. Keywords should ideally be phrases of 2-4 words; single word keywords are acceptable, but they may lead to many false matches. 3. Keywords should contain words and phrases that suggest what the topic is about. Also include words and phrases that are closely related to your topic.
